1. One System Questions
  - a. How tall is the Eiffel Tower?
  - b. What is the MSRP of the Nintendo Switch in Japan?
  - c. Is it raining now?
2. No System Questions
  - a. What would you like to eat?
  - b. Where do you want to travel next?
  - c. What do you like to do after work?
3. Conflicting System Questions
  - a. Should we eat meat?
  - b. Is anyone truly free?
  - c. Should minimum wage be higher?

**Respond to Questions**

1. What is an example of a simple conceptual question? Why is this conceptual question simple?
  - a. Is someone who drives over the speed limit a responsible driver?
  - b. I think that this is a simple conceptual question because, by definition, a responsible driver should follow driving rules. One driving rule is driving under the speed limit. Therefore, a driver who drives over the speed limit is not a responsible driver. This question is easily answered and there probably will not be a debate about it.
2. What is an example of a complex conceptual question? Why is this conceptual question complex?
  - a. Is social media good?
  - b. I think that this is a complex conceptual question because there are multiple perspectives to this situation. Depending on who you ask and what the context is, the consumption of social media can be good or bad. For instance, it is good in that it can be used to communicate with loved one. It can be bad in that it can be used to spread fake news.
