
Module 10 Assignment

- a. A key idea that I have learned is the importance of having a liberal-minded approach when consuming news, particularly when it comes to politics. - b. In other words, by carefully considering multiple perspectives, journalists can strive to provide a more accurate representation of the world around us.

This statement caused an immediate loss of confidence among government supporters.

- a. A key idea that I have learned is the issue of fake news is increasingly prevalent and well-documented, the term itself is often misused to discredit news sources or stories that one simply disagrees with, or wishes were untrue.
- b. In other words that the fake news refers to intentionally fabricated information spread through digital platforms, but the misuse of the term has unfortunately become a common tactic to dismiss legitimate reporting that may be uncomfortable or conflicting for certain individuals or groups. This misuse detracts from the seriousness of the actual problem of deliberate misinformation and undermines the credibility of honest journalism.
- c. An example of this idea manifesting in the real world is a recent news story displayed a manipulated photo from a meeting of the main opposition party in Turkey, distorted through photomontage. This defamatory report painted a negative picture, although another news outlet later revealed the real photo and confirmed that the fake photo was produced through photomontage.
- d. An analogy or illustration of this idea can be described as follows confessing his sin of gossiping, a parishioner sought relief from the priest, who instructed him to bring a feather pillow from home.
